- **Optometry, Koeller St**, \$3,242.86 Equip one exam room to accommodate patients in wheelchairs with the purchase of the Reliance Full Power Tilt and Reliance Stand with Console
- **Pediatrics, Oakwood**, \$587.94 Purchase a playhouse for the waiting room
- **Urgent Care, Koeller St**, \$3,709.44 Purchase an otoscope and ophthalmoscope allowing providers to better screen for illness during medical visits in Urgent Care.

Mercy Medical Center

- **Behavioral Health**, \$475.⁰⁰ Purchase new educational materials for patients receiving treatment for a broad spectrum of mental health and substance abuse disorders
- **Cancer**, \$1,700.⁰⁰ "For your well being " AromaTouch. The program will support the cancer center's vision of care for the whole person, mind body spirit. Human touch which will be offered with the aroma touch technique which is very fundamental with respect to healing and a sense of well being. Human touch with the use of essential oils will enable a lasting connection between staff and patients
- **Cancer**, \$10,000.⁰⁰ *For your well being "Michael D. Watchel walk for Cancer"*. An opportunity for us to celebrate our cancer patients and families, a gathering, celebration, recognition and remembrance of those currently going through their cancer journey as well as those who have not survived. This brings our community together and allows us to share stories of joy, hope and sadness through a walk that emphasizes the courage and passion demonstrated by our cancer patients that we celebrate and honor. This is also a most meaningful way for us to showcase our wholistic program, driven by our vision
- **Patient Business Services**, \$15,000 Basic Needs Program. Typically these funds are used to cover the cost of prescriptions and transportation for those individuals who either are underinsured or uninsured. These are one-time patient emergency needs.
- **Rehab, Koeller St**, \$8,010.⁰⁰ Mechanical Traction, a device used to assist patients with neck or back pain or radiating symptoms from the low back or neck
- **Rehab, Koeller St**, \$5,728.⁰⁰ NuStep treadmill which can be used for a wide variety of reasons including: range of motion, conditioning, strengthening, warm up, and neuromuscular re-education

- **Rehab, Winneconne, \$5,728.⁰⁰** NuStep treadmill which can be used for a wide variety of reasons including: range of motion, conditioning, strengthening, warm up, and neuromuscular re-education
- **Rehab, Outpatient, \$10,283.22** PEACE Program, a cancer exercise/support group that meets 2x a week for 2 hours a session. The program focuses on continued support, education, socialization, exercise, balance, range of motion, and functional activities as tolerated
- **Rehab, Outpatient, \$21,072.64** Fitness for the Physically Challenged program is designed for people with permanent physical disabilities or severe medical conditions that do not allow them to safely exercise in other types of exercise environments. The objective of this service is to provide individuals with disabilities an opportunity to improve their health, fitness level, activity tolerance and confidence in a supervised setting. This program focuses on safety and accessibility in an encouraging and positive environment.
- **Safety & Security, \$875.⁰⁰** DAAT Instructor Course. DAAT is the official law enforcement standard and supported by the Wisconsin Department of Justice for any use of force being used by security officers and/or police officers. The DAAT course covers all use of force training with unarmed tactics for violent and resistive behavior, to weapon retention and disarming
- **Safety & Security, \$4,940.90** Digital Mobile Radio The Digital Mobile Radio product will allow MMC security officers to use their mobile radios when called outside of the building tending to patients, visitors and/or associates. to ensure security officers are able to communicate both inside and outside of the hospital grounds
